 hired out early for cash so long as my
 executors shall think proper to continue in
 that line the rent of the plantation left
 to Randle is to be applied to schooling him
 the girls to be taught reading, writing etc.
 out of the income of my estate the balance
 of my income to be applied to the education
 of my son Henry so far as to give him a
 liberal education, the balance if any to be
 equally divided amongst my heirs. I desire
 the debts due me and my pork to discharge
 my debts. So be it I appoint Amy Davis
 and Wm. Young my executors to execute this
