Will.

In the name of God Amen I, James McCartney of Muhlenberg County and state of Kentucky, being low in health but of perfect mind & memory and calling to mind that it is appointed for all man-kind once to die, do make, ordain & publish this to be my last will & testament.

Item 1st. I give and bequeath to my nephews, Thomas & James McCartney the tract of land lying on the waters of Cypress Creek in Muhlenberg County containing two hundred acres entered, surveyed & patented in my own name to them and their heirs forever, but if they or either of them should not come to this county and demand the same of Thos. Irwin Senr. then in that case the same is to descend & belong to the said Thomas Irwin & his heirs forever.

Item 2nd. It is also my will and desire

that the land I own lying in the county aforesaid on the waters of Pond river containing one hundred acres entered and surveyed in my own name be & the same is hereby given to the said Thomas Irwin & his heirs forever.

Item 3rd. I hereby give and devise to ^{my} Mary Irwin my two bay horses one of which is seven years old this spring & the other horse five years old this spring also my young sorrel mare four years old to her & her heirs forever.

Item 4th. I also give and bequeath to Thos. Irwin Sr. all the balance of my stock consisting of horses, cattle & hogs and my farming utensils to be him hereafter disposed of in any manner he may think proper and I also hereby request and authorize the said Thos. Irwin to collect my accounts & keep and apply the same to his own proper use. I hereby appoint Thos. Irwin Sr. executor of or to this my last will and testament hereby revoking and making void any other former will or wills by me made and ratifying and confirming this to be my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have herunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal this 21st day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & fourteen.
