

William Allison's Will.

I, William Allison, of the state of Kentucky and Muhlenberg County constitute, ordain and establish this my last will and testament.

It is my will and desire that my friends William Dumber & Hugh Carter after my death shall sell all my stock, household & kitchen furniture giving twelve months credit thereon.

It is also my friends William Dumber and Hugh Carter shall sell my land whereon I now live and give 6 years credit. All my notes will be collected as they fall due for the use of my children.

Immediately after the money becomes due my will and desire is that it be put into the treasury and the interest thereof to be applied to the benefit of the youngest children.

It is also my will and desire that as each of my children becomes of age they shall draw their proportionable part. This is my last will and testament, sealed with my seal.

Will.

In the name of God Amen. I, John Roth of the County of Muhlenberg, state of Kentucky, Turner being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to God, calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say principally and first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it, my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but all the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give, demise, and dispose of the same in the following manner and form. First I give and bequeath to each of my lawful heirs the sum of one hundred and twenty cents to be paid out of my estate also so much of said estate as

shall be sufficient to discharge all lawful demands to be disposed of at the discretion of my executors and punctually paid. Second. the balance of said estate I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife, Charity, whom I likewise constitute, make and ordain the executrix of my last will and testament. I also constitute Silas Drake an executor with Charity my wife and I do hereby utterly disallow & revoke all and every other former testament, will, bequest or executors confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have herunto set my hand and seal. This 5th day of July In the year of our Lord 1814. Signed, sealed and delivered by the said John Gott as his last will and testament in the presence of us who in his presence and in the presence of each other have herunto subscribed our names.
