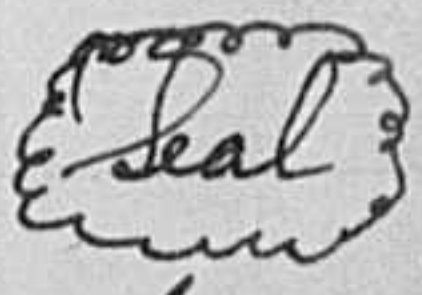

 if obtained lying in Boone County on the  
 waters of Licking deated for me by Simon  
 Kenton also Twelve hundred acres located in  
 my name by Thomas Clark lying on sandy  
 if obtained to him and his heirs forever. also  
 my saddle and bridle and suit of black clothes  
 Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Janitt  
 love Two Dollars to her and her heirs forever.  
 Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife  
 Nancy all the remainder of my Estate both  
 real and person all to be Disposed of by her  
 as she may think except two Iron pots and

an oven which after her death my will is  
shall go to my son William him and  
his Heirs forever. I nominate and do by  
these presence appoint my beloved wife  
Nancy and my son William Campbell  
Executors of this my last will and Testament  
Hereby Revoking and Disannulling all former  
and other wills by me made and  
ratifying and declaring this and no other
