and during her natural lifetime.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup>. I give and bequeath to my three  
daughters Polly, Anne & Sally, my negro  
woman named Phebe and her two children  
Philes and Tony to them and their heirs  
forever.

Item 4<sup>th</sup>. I leave to my two sons John and  
Nathan the tract of land where I now live  
containing two hundred acres to be equally  
divided between them, to them and their  
heirs forever. Likewise my negro girl Aggy  
to be equally divided between them by my  
executors my will is that my stock &  
farming utensils be kept together for the  
support of my wife and family. It is also  
my will that my lots in Lewisburg and  
such property as my executors may think  
can be spared best without injuring my  
family (should it be thought necessary by  
them) as will be sufficient to paying just  
debts untill my youngest child come of
