acres of land whereon he now lives, a part of the Tract of
land whereon I now live likewise I give and bequeath
to my son Elias and David Peyton the Remainder of
the said Tract of land after the death of my wife Susan
with all the moveable effects excepting a cow and
calf and a feather Bed to each of my three Daughters
Lucy Jimimah and Fanny and my son Evan and
Lastly I will that my beloved wife Susan be my
Executrix and my trusty friends James Rogers and
Thomas Polke be my Executors of this my last will
and Testament the word son in the thirteenth line and
the word Divided between in Eighteenth line was inter-
lined before the signing and sealing of
Signed sealed Ratified and Confirmed in the pres-
ence of this 27th day of March 1789

In the name of God Amen I Laurence Muse of
Nelson County, Kentucky, being in perfect health
and sound Memory doth make and Ordain this my
last will and Testament -
Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife
Elizabeth Muse, one Negro boy named George, also
One Thousand acres of land in the waters of Beechcreek
to be taken out of a Tract of three Thousand Acres
Deeded and Recorded to me from Mark Thomas,
of Jefferson County, also all my household furniture,
and the one half of debt due me by Brook Beasly
bonds notes or otherwise, also my horse saddle &
Bridle, all which I give and bequeath to her for
ever, that she may act do or dispose of any the above
Articles as she pleases -
If in case I have an heir I give and bequeath unto such
heir three Thousand Acres of land Two thousand of
which is Residue of the above mentioned three Thou-
sand Acres obtained of the aforesaid Mark Thomas
the other Thousand lying on the Ohio River a little
above the mouth of Lichen Creek. also Give negro
a fellow named Billy & a Negro Woman named
Simah. at the death of George Muse my father.
I am intitled to those two Negroes all which I give
and bequeath unto such heirs, to wit, if I have no heir
Should I have no such heir, then it is my will and
desire that the Negro Woman Simah at the death
of my Father be delivered up to my wife Elizabeth
Muse which I bequeath to her & her heirs &

All the rest of my Estate Except my house and lot
at the falls of Ohio - I give and bequeath wither
such be Real personal or Chattles: unto my father
George. Mine to him & his heirs for ever

It is my will and desire that my house and
lot at the falls of Ohio. be sold at public Vendue
after such Vendue have been three months previ-
ously advertised to pay of my just debts, should
there any by thing left after my debts are paid
from the sale of the s^d house, that such Residue
be Equally divided between my wife and my
Sother. to them and their heirs for ever

It is my will and desire that my father
accomplish the Contract between Isaac Davis &
myself Respecting the land I now live on, & that
he pay for such land out of his Thirteen hundred
Acres tract ly on the waters of Bearshuans Creek of
which I am intitled to five hundred Acres

It is my will and desire that the one half of the
tract of land whereon I now live, be laid off to my
father. And the other half to my wife, which
I give and bequeath to them and their heirs
for ever

And lastly I appoint Isaac Morrison Col^l John
Caldwell my father George Muse, & Cap^t Mark
Thomas Executors to this my last will and Testa-
ment in Witness whereof I have set my hand
and seal this 5th day of February 1789

paid, after which and my funeral expenses
defrayed, I bequeath to my beloved wife Jane her choice of
my two lots in Barren Town with the appurtenances during
her natural life, also my boy race women riding saddle
last feather bed and such cows now belonging to me as she
may choose together with one equal third part of all the
residue of my personal estate I bequeath to my said wife
ever to be disposed of as she shall in such way and manner
as she may see cause
