Thirdly I will that all my lands that I own on the waters of Green River be Equally divided between my sons and daughters sons, Elijah Elias Elias Daniel and Evan Peyton Daughters Ruth Anne Sucky Jimimah and Fanny Peyton except my daughter Anne's part of said land which is to Equally Divided between her and her eldest son Peyton. Thirdly Likewise I will that my son Elijah shall make choice for my son Evan his part of said land to join upon an out side line and in a regular form and at the said the Evans death if not sold by him and no lawfull heir then to Return to the said Elijah, and if he dying without a lawfull heir then to be Equally divided between Elias and Dan^l Peyton and Sucky Jimimah and Fanny Peyton Likewise I give and bequeath to my son Evan a Negro boy named will after the decease of my wife Susannah till his death if he dies without a lawfull he is to Return to my son Elijah and if he dies without a lawfull heir then he is to be valued or sold and Equally divided between Elias & Daniel Peyton and Sucky Jimimah and Fanny Peyton.
