this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following
Wit. That is to say I purpouse That my body shall be decently
buried and all my Just debts shall be paid by my Executors as soon
as possible after my decease. I have I give and bequeath unto
my wife Elizabeth all my real and personal estate in land Tithes
and stock of Horses Cattle Sheep and my household furniture
until my son Walter should be of the age Twenty one years at which
time it is my pleasure that he shall have one third part my land
estate And also when my son Stephen shall arrive at the age of
Twenty one years that he shall be entitled to one other third part
of my land estate and the other third part to be the right of my wife
during her natural life but in case that either of my sons should
die before they arrive at the age of Twenty one years as aforesaid
then it is my Will and pleasure that his third part of my land estate
shall fall unto the surviving son and that he shall in his Will
third parts of my land estate and in case both of my sons should
die before they arrive at the age of Twenty one years as aforesaid then
that my land estate shall be equally divided amongst my daughters
as in the disposition of my Executors that it shall be sold and the money
arising from the sale thereof shall be equally divided amongst them
Wit. In regard to my Tithes I have them and their increase wholly to
my wife Elizabeth during her Widowhood but in case my wife Elizabeth
shall marry then she shall be entitled to one third part of my land
estate and an equal share of my Tithes and other personal estate
with my children And I do hereby constitute and appoint my wife
Elizabeth my sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament but
in case my wife Elizabeth should die before her husband is dead
then I appoint Thomas Brown and Jacob Brown my Executors
as that this my last Will and Testament shall be taken account
according to the true meaning and intent thereof fully executing all
things in this my last Will and Testament hereunto I do hereby

have servants, servants, and servants first day of April and from
of our Lord our thousand seven hundred and eighty three.
