 derstanding, the weak and low in body, do make this my
 last will and testament.

Infirmities, I give and bequeath my soul to God my Maker
 humbly praying that he will in mercy receive
 Infirmities, I give my body to the earth, to be turned into
 corruption, In full and certain hope of its resurrection with
 last day.

And for my worldly goods
 Item I will and require, that all my debts be fully paid
 by the settlement of my true and loving friend John M.
 Cuthings, whom I have chosen by his own consent to be my
 whole and sole Executor of this my last will & testament
 before this my last will & testament performed.

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Anne
 the lot of land now live in, with all its buildings and
 improvements to have undisturbed possession thereof dur-
 ing her life, which I desire may be regulated by my young
 son Thomas. He giving her one half the profits of said farm
 to have I give and bequeath unto her, and all my farming stock
 at the death of my wife. I then give to my grandson Jacob Cuthings
 one of the above buildings, to have full and perfect enjoyment, in and to the
 live with, and is to be his and his heirs forever. I then give
 desire that after the death of my loving wife Anne the lot of land I now
 live in, with all the rest of my worldly effects may be equally divided among
 my children (viz) William Cuthings, Thomas Cuthings, John Cuthings
 Samuel Cuthings, and Jacob Cuthings.

A Court held for Nelson County, on the fourth day of December 1787. the within last will and testament of William Collings Esq. was produced by John Mc Gee the executor therein mentioned, and being proved by the oaths of David Reily, John Park & William Giff the subscribing witnesses, was ordered to be recorded.

In the name of God Amen. I John Brants of Nelson County, and Commonwealth of Virginia, do certify and affirm, this my last will and testament in manner and form following Viz
 Principally and first of all I do give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that provides nothing doubting, but at the general resurrection I shall rise again by the mighty power of God. And as for my personal property estate wheresoever I have placed the Lord to bless me with in this life. I do give, devise and dispose of the same as followeth
 To-wit. I do give unto my two daughters Elizabeth and Polly, each one hundred acres of Land to be laid off, each one of the tract of land I now live on. And I give unto my beloved wife Hannah Brants the other hundred acres

of land ^{which} I now have in making the above bequest, and I do give all my other estate as movable property effects after my just debts are paid, they have to remain to her. And her heirs for ever to will and dispose of as they shall think proper and I do constitute my said wife, sole executrix of this my last will and testament.

I have also a quantity of land, of three hundred acres in Fayette County. I do leave the said land divided equally between my said wife and two daughters, after the expenses are paid. Witness my hand and seal this 17 day of September 1786
