Know all men by these presents that we James Gray James Rogers, and Anthony Foster are held and firmly bound unto Isaac Cox Benjamin Pope David Cox and Charles Pette in the full sum of two Thousand pounds specie of Virginia to which payment well and truly to be made we bind our selves jointly and severally our joint and several heirs jointly by these presents sealed with our seals and dated this twenty seventh day of Dec^r 1786

The Condition of the Above Obligation is Such that whereas the above bound James Gray is appointed by the Court of Nelson, Guardian to Charles Northam - Orphan if therefore the said James Gray shall well and truly execute the office of Guardian according to Law, then this Obligation to be void otherwise in full force.
