Executors, and as Touching my worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased
God to bless me with in this life I give demise and dispose of in the
following manner,

First I give to my well beloved sons my horses and implements in an
equal proportion Namely, Randolph, John, Anthony, James, Henry,
and Matthew only I will they shate not dispose of the same till all
come to age and then by the consent of each other. Item next I give to my
dearest daughter Sarah such of my property as she has already got and
ten Shillings more than I give to my daughters Catherine, Mary and
Honey an equal share of my goods and Chattels and also my sons
to have an equal share of my goods and Chattels with they of my daugh-
ters only I will that such of my children as wants schooling to be
school'd and at the expense of my sons Item I give to my well
beloved wife Susannah such portion of my Estate as she lives direct
during her natural life and not to destroy the same and at her
decease to be divided between all the Children and so I sign me in
this my last will and testament I appoint my trusty friends
Benjamin Ogden and William Hays my Executors shure to this
and set my hand and Seal, June 25th 1792.
