wife as also that if any of my Children
should die and leave no Issue that their
part shall be equally divided amongs my
Children and wife and at the discretion
of my wife whether she marries or remains
my ^{widow} shall my Children be brought up
and if need require she may choose guardians
for them her part she may with or she shall
