twelfth day of March 1799 I James Brown of
Nelson County and State of Kentucky being
very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind &
giving thanks be given unto God. Therefore calling
unto mind the mortality of my body, & knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die do make
ordain this my last will & Testament. That is to say
principally and first of all, I give and recommend
my soul into the hands of Almighty God that
give it and my body to the earth, to be decently
buried at the direction of my Executors nothing
doubting but at the general resurrection I shall
receive the same again by power of Almighty
God. and as touching such worldly estate wherewith
it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I
give remise and dispose of the same in the follow-
ing manner and form.

Imprimis, I give and bequeath to Semimah
my dearly beloved wife the one third part of all
my lands, to be laid off so as to include my dwell-
ing house with all the other houses, standing in
and about the yard of the s. dwelling house, and
also running to include with s. ^{house} one third part of
the cleared land together with a third part of the
wood land, also to include the garden belonging
to me at the s. dwell. during her life but after
her decease to descend to my beloved ^{wife} Sons James
Brown, and Levi Brown to be equally divided

between them according to quantity.
 Item, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife
 the third part of all my personal estate, except-
 ing one feather bed and furniture, which I give &
 bequeath to my beloved daughter Hannah
 Craven.

Item, I give and bequeath the residue of my
 personal estate to be equally divided among all
 my children except James Craven and Levi Craven.

Item, I give and bequeath the other two thirds of all
 my lands after my wife's third is first laid off
 to be divided between my two sons James Craven
 and Levi Craven to be divided according to your

quantity and I do likewise constitute make &
 ordain Samuel McAdams and Jeremiah
 Craven my sole executors of this my last will and
 Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow, re-
 voke and disannul all and every other former
 Testament, wills, legacies, and bequests, and
 executors by me named, willed, and bequeathed,
 ratifying and confirming this and no other
 to be my last will Testament. In Witness where-
