 I John Armstrong of the County of Nelson
 And State of Kentucky Being very sick &
 weak, in or imperfect health of body, but in and
 of perfect mind and Memory thanks be given
 unto God Calling unto mind the mortality
 of my body, and knowing that it is Appointed
 for all men ^{once} to die, I do make and ordain, this
 my last will and Testament, that is to say First
 especially, and first of all I give and recommend my
 soul to unto the hands of the Almighty God, that

gave it, and my body I do commend to the Earth;
 to be buried in a Decent Christian Burial at the
 Discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting but at
 the General Resurrection I shall receive the same
 again by the mighty Power of God, and as Touching
 such worldly estates wherewith it has pleased God
 to bless me in this life, I give devise and Dispose of
 the same in the following manner and form. First I
 give and Bequeath, to Mary Willhoit a wife of Tobias
 Willhoites a tract of land lying on Monogahela on
 Millinger Creek, formerly belonging to John Armstrong
 Senr And to their Daughter Mary Willhoit I give
 my Marshall, also I give to her what Grain is sowed
 in Henry Crist Mills, and what is coming for the
 Horse that I kept ^{at} Henry Crist in the year 1799. and
 the third part of the wheel that I raised in that
 year, on the plantation that Henry Crist bought of
 Michael Keshum; And also I give to Tobias Willhoit
 my Saddle Bridle and Saddle bags, & Clothes, and
 the third ^{part} of the Tie that I raised in the year 1799.
 And what Henry Crist owes me, is to pay my debt
 And also the rest of what Crist owes me I give to
 Sister Margaret Howe And by them freely to be possessed
 and enjoyed, I do likewise constitute And appoint,
 Aaron Gessathouse and Abraham Willhoit, to be
 Executors of this my last will and Testament, I do
 hereby utterly Disallow, Revoke and Annul, all and
 every other former Testament Wills Legacies & Bequests
 And Executions, by me in any wise before named
 written and Bequeathed, Ratifying and Confirming
 this and no other to be my last will and Testament
