Children and wife and at the discretion
of my wife wheather she marries or remains
my ^{widow} shall my Children be brought up
and if need require she may choose guardians
for them her part she may with will shall

I William Briggs of the County of Nelson and State of Kentucky being in a low state of health, but of sound mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die and that no dispute may arise after my death concerning my Estate both real and personal I dispose of it in the following manner to wit. I give and bequeath to my son David a tract of land which I bought of Francis Berry containing three hundred acres lying on the north side of Kentucky River, and two Cows & Calves, also four horses and three Saddles of pretty pounds value & likewise a Negro woman named Wenny & her daughter
