In the name of God amen I John Lewis
 of Nelson County and District of Kentucky
 being very sick and weak in body but of perfect
 mind and Memory thanks be to God for the
 same but calling to mind the Mortality of
 my body & that it is appointed for all men once to
 die do make & ordain this my last Will and
 Testament. And first of all I recommend my soul
 to the hands of Almighty God that gave it and
 my body to the earth to be Buried in a Christian
 like and decent manner at the Discretion of my
 Executors nothing doubting but at the general

Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty
 power of God And as touching such worldly effects which
 with it pleased God to bless me with in this life I give devise
 and dispose of the same in the following manner
 I give devise & dispose to my will beloved wife
 Mary Lewis all and singular my personal Estate by her
 and her heirs or assigns, freely to be enjoyed. Also my
 Negro Woman Mary (a free use) during my my longer
 life time Also the sole benefit of my Plantation whereon
 I now live together with the use of my other Negroes
 until my children comes to be age for the use there
 Maintenance and schooling and then the land and
 Negroes to be equally Divided between my children
 in Manner following Viz. One fourth of the two thirds
 of s^r land and one fourth of the then value of s^r Negroes
 to each one at the time of his or her being of age. But if any
 of the children should die before they come of age then a
 proportion to be given to the survivors according to their
 numbers then living. But should any of s^r Negroes prove
 Disobedient to their Masters in such case the said my

Executors shall be at liberty to sell them or any one of them and buy others in their stead with his or their prices. And after my wife deces many other Inceas shall be equally divided (or there Valuation) between my Children And be it understood that should the Education of my Children be neglected or that they shute not be taken care of in a Christian like manner than then and in that case (when made apcar) it shall be in the power of my Executors to have Guardians appointed and the use that part of my Estate before Mensioned for that purpose shall be put in their care and appropriated as before directed Item I allow so much of my other lands to be sold by my Executors as shall discharge all my Lawfull debts But the Expences of Administration it is to be ^{leave} ~~from~~ out of my personal Estate Item I give and dispose of all and singular my other Estate in Lands &c to be equally divided according to Rachel Wallers between my Children to be by them freely to be enjoyed by them there heirs & assigns

Forever together with the remaining of the lands on which I now live after my wife deces. And I do hereby appoint my trusty friends Robt Hodgson Isaac Lewis Junr. and Philip Phillips the sole Executors of this my last will & Testament and I do hereby disanul all other Wills ^{or legacies} heretofore granted or bequeathed by me Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this 3 day of Jan^r 1792 John Lewis
