

men once to die, do make & ordain this my last will and Testament principally & first of all I give my soul into the hands of God that gave all, & for my body I recommend it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like & decent manner at the Discretion of My Executors nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God that gave all, & as touching such worldly estate as wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I do give devise & dispose of the same in manner & form following Viz, I lend to my loving wife Molly during her natural life the land and Plantation I now live & one Negro boy called Damon together with my household goods & mean the first by her to be possessed & enjoyed. Then, Whereas I have given to my son Thomas Kenscheloe & my Daughter Peggy Davis their full parts of my Estate in full my desire is they should have no more of my estate either real or personal. Then I give & bequeath to my son Stephen Kenscheloe the sum of thirty pounds to be paid him in lands besides what I have already given him, to him & his heirs forever as his full part of my Estate. Then I give & bequeath to my Daughter Molly Davis the sum of sixty five pounds to be paid her in lands to her & her heirs forever & do assign it her portion of my Estate. Then I give & bequeath to my other two Daughters, Mary & Sally Kenscheloe Seventy pounds each to be paid them in Land when they come of age or marry to them & their heirs forever as their portion of my estate. Then I give & bequeath the remainder of my Estate to be equally divided between my four Youngest sons Viz, Lewis, Elias, Isaac & William Kenscheloe to be

be delivered to them when they come to the age of twenty one years to them & their heirs forever & should any of the above mentioned children die before they receive their portions I desire their parts may be equally divided between the whole of my children. Then I leave the use of my estate to my wife for the support of my Younger Children the appointed time for them to receive their parts & after my wife's decease I desire the remainder may be equally divided between my four Youngest sons above mentioned. and lastly do constitute make & ordain my wife Executrix with my son Lewis Kenscheloe to be executors of this my last will and Testament & I do utterly disallow revoke and disannul all & every thing that hath been by me and last before written on or bequeathed Ratifying and confirming this & no other to be my last will & Testament, given under my hand and seal the day & year above written.
