to take me to himself into that peace and Rest and incomprehens-
ible glory which he has prepared for all that love and fear his holy

thence at the last day. As for my burial I desire it may be decent
without pomp or State at the direction of my Dear wife and my

put out to use till they come to age, and the boys to put to trades
as they that are come to years sufficient may choose, as to the girls
I leave my wife to do as she thinks fit. I will my Wife Give with
the Cutenworths, belonging to my son Joseph besides his equal share
with the rest, but if my wife should marry, she shall not have
any of my Estate more than her thirds. I will to my son
Jared one Cow and Breeding cow, besides what he has already
got. Likewise I will to my son John and all my Daughters
that is now married five Shillings sterling apiece, besides
what they have already got. I will that if any of the

Boys were to be sojourning as not to be obedient to their Mother
that the exors shall bind them out to servants I will that my
Heirs and Brethren John Larue Robert Woodger together
my well beloved wife and do constitute them Executors of this
my last will and testament and trustees for my wife and
