rest of my property I leave to my brother Eletha Payton my part of land is to be equally divided among my brother and sister this is wrote in a hurry but must be comply with as my last will and a testament

E² In the Name of God Amen I Malthus Wakefield of the County of Nelson State of Kentucky being weak and sickly in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks to God calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die I now make and ordain this my last will and a testament. That is to say first of all I recommend my soul to God that gave it & my body to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of ^{my} executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive
