Lawfull Righten Ease, then that land is to be divided equ-
ally divided. Between my beloved wife Elizabeth my beloved
Brother Silas Hart. I do here appoint Edward Raulings and
Stephen Raulings and Samuel Hayscraft my three Executors and
I do hereby acknowledge this my last will and Testament
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
this 6th day of September One thousand seven hundred &
Eighty nine. —
