In the name of God amen I Peter Brown
being sick of body but of perfect mind and memory thank
be to god for it therefore calling to mind that it is appoin-
ted for all men to die I do make and Ordain this my
last will and Testament this 15th day of January 1792
First and principally of all I do give my soul to
Almighty God that gave it and my body to the earth
from whence it came to be buried in such Christian
like manner as my Executor hereafter named shall
think fit nothing doubting but at the general Resurrec-
tion I shall receive the same again by the mighty power
of Almighty God and as touching such worldly goods as
God has blessed me with I dispose of them in the manner
and form following Viz. I give and bequeath unto
my loving wife Frances Brown my now dwelling
Plantation with one hundred acres of land thence
adjoining during her natural life after her decease this
tract of land to be equally divided in quality and
quantity between my sons Serebo and Brown and
Peter Brown except the improvement which Serebo and
Brown is to have, and if Serebo and Brown gets Peter

76 Known as much Land in quantity and quality he is
to have the whole of it. Then I give and bequeath unto
my two sons Charles Brown and Francis Brown
two hundred Acres of Land on Standens Creek to be
divided equally in quantity and quality between
them, to them and their heirs forever and if either of
them should die without heirs the survivor is to have
his part. Then I give and bequeath unto my Daughter
Ann Brown a mare Colt that came of a Mare called
fly (she giving the first Colt it brings to my Daughter
Rose Brown) and one feather Bed one of my best pewter
dishes, four plates one Iron pot, one bow with half one
yew with lam, and one sow ~~with~~ and pigs. Then I
give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ellen Brown
the Colt ~~to~~ my small Mare fetches on the value of it
and one Feather Bed one pewter dish three plates
one Iron pot, one bow with half one yew with lam
and one sow with pig. Then I give and bequeath
unto my Daughter Rose Brown one feather Bed one
pewter Dish and three plates one Iron pot one bow

77 with half one yew with lam and one sow with pig. Then
I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Brown
all the part of my estate she is in possession of that I gave
her as her full part of it. Then I also give and bequeath unto
my loving wife Frances Brown and to my Daughter
Ann Brown each of them one Hommers saddle And
I give the remaining part of my Estate to be Divided
equally between my seven Children, Jacobson Brown
Ann Brown Ellen Brown Peter Brown Charles
Brown Francis Brown & Rose Brown. And lastly
I appoint my son Jacobson Brown to be my whole and
sole Executor of this my last will and Testament revoking
all other will or wills by me made but declares this to be
my last will and Testament In witness whereof I do
hereunto set my hand and for my seal

January 23. 1789 Nelson County Seat of Vir-
ginia. This is my last will and Testament first
I recommend my Soul to God who gave it And all my
other concerns. Second all my lawful debts to be paid
Thirdly it is my request to have the Hundred A-
kers of Land sold that formerly belonged to John
Lee lying on the Nolichucky Forks. Fourthly I bequeath
unto my wife Elizabeth Reed all my worldly Affairs
for the Maintenance & breeding of my children And

at her Death the Land is to be Equely divided between
my four Boys John Reed Archibald Reed & Charles Reed
& William Reed. Fifthly I do leave Phillip Phillips with
my wife Elizabeth Reed to be Executors
