 different surveys viz 125 acres of Balise convey 25 of
 Lincoln and 14 of Rogers and it is my will & desire
 that if any claim or encumbrance should disturb
 the B. Benjamin my son in the quiet possession of this
 tract or plantation that all costs and damages
 shall be paid out of the residue of my estate ex-
 cepting my wife Sarah's lawful demand.

In the second place I give and bequeath to my
 daughter Gilly Stigler a certain tract or parcel of
 land containing 200 acres more or less lying in
 Hardin County on Rough Creek &c. &c. having
 a bond for the same assigned by Samuel Brown
