God the Father. And as for my body my Will and desire is
that it may be buried ^{decently} in a Christian like manner
and all my honest debts paid off by my Executors
hereafter named. And as for what worldly goods
God hath been pleased to bless me with I give and be-
queath in the following manner My Item I give
and bequeath to my loving wife Ann Willett the planta-
tion where I now live on to be at her command during
her natural life or Widowhood and at her Death
or Marriage to be equally divided amongst my four
Children hereafter named with all its Benefits that

It may please and further I give my loving Wife Ann
two Negro Men named Peter and Susan to be at her
Command till Death and then to be by her disposed of -
she may think proper only my four Children is to receive
Clothed and maintained out of their labour till the come of
age with help of the plantation and also my desire is that
my wife Ann have her thirds of all my personal prop-
erty except the Negroes hereafter named and the money
or Negroes or other property that may belong to my
Estate coming from the State of Maryland also I give
to my son John Willett a Negro boy named Toby and when
the Negro boy comes to the age of fourteen to be hired out
for the use of S. Toby till he comes of age. Also I give my three
Children Mary Willett, William Willett and Eliza-
beth Willett the Negro Woman named Fella and all
her increase to be equally divided between them when the
come of age and when the Money or property comes from
the State of Maryland to be added to the three part last
named and if not brought in a Negro the money or

Goods to be disposed of for a Negro or Negroes
as my Executors may think best and all my
Estate both real and Personall I desire to be
equally divided amongst ^{also} my Children before
mentioned with having regard to their ^{mother's}
thirds and the gifts mentioned to her and their own
gifts specified and if any of my Children should
die without Issue their part or parts to be equally
divided amongst the survivors. Also I nominate
my loving Wife Ann Willitt and George Willitt
Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby
revoking all other Wills by me made hereby declar-
ing this only to be my last Will and Testament as
witness my hand and Seal this 22^d day of November
