memory and calling to mind the certainty of death
and the uncertainty of the time when as for the dis-
posing of my Worldly goods and affairs make and
ordain this my last will and Testament as followeth

To Wit Impresse it is my desire that my Body & Dearly
beloved and my funeral Charges and Just Debts paid
by my Executors hereafter mentioned I give and be-
queath unto my beloved Daughter Rebecca Beall half
a Dozen Silver Table spoons during her Natural life And
after her Death to fall to her Daughter Sarah Beall to her
and her heirs forever I give and Bequeath unto my
beloved Grand Daughter Sarah Beall Daughter of Rebecca
Beall thirty Pounds Virginia Money And all the Interest
arising from the same to be paid to the said Sarah Beall at
the age of fifteen years to her and heirs Also one Feather
Bed and bolster and under-sea and one bundle box
for her part of my Estate I give and bequeath unto my
beloved Grandson Samuel Beall son of Rebecca Beall sixteen
Pounds Virginia Money with all the Interest arising from the
same to be paid to the said Samuel Beall at the age of Eigh-
teen to him or his heirs Also half a Dozen Silver Table Spoon
to him and his heirs for his part of my Estate And it is my
desire that the two above mentioned together shall be paid the

Above sums out of a Debt due me from these Father
 Walter Beall for one third part of my former Husband's
 Personal Estate which he had in his hands to hold
 Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter
 Anna Harrison half a Dozen Silver Table spoons du-
 ring her Natural life and after her Death to her Daughter
 Sally Harrison to her and her heirs forever. Also all the
 Interest that shall be due me at my Death on a bond
 from Walter Beall for the Rite of Down in a tract of
 land called Jonewick being the Rite of my former husband
 Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Grand Daugh-
 ter Sally Harrison Daughter of Anna Harrison Forty
 pound Virginia Money with all the Interest arising from
 the same for the term of three years And then it is my desire
 that the said Money and Interest be laid out in Land
 at the best advantage by my two Executors and the said
 land to be conveyed to the said Sally Harrison to her
 and her heirs forever. and it is my desire that the said
 land be Rented out till the said Sally Harrison come
 to the age of fifteen and then the said land given into

The Possession of the said Sally Harrison in her heirs with
 all the benefits arising therefrom. Also one Feather bed
 and all my bed Furniture one best one Trunk one picture
 pot to her and her heirs And it is my Will and desire
 that my two Negroes to wit Dena and Mager be here about
 yearly as long as they shall live by my Executor to the best ad-
 vantage for Cash to such places as they will not be ill used
 And that money put to Interest and that interest put to Interest
 And all the Principle and the Interest be equally divided
 between all the surviving Children of my beloved Daughter
 Anna Harrison's body as they severally come of age with all
 the ballance of my Estate to them and their heirs forever
 And it is my desire that all the Money the above Negroes
 shall be hired for shall be yearly Entered on the Parish Re-
 cord of the County. Item I give unto my friend Lydia Dornay
 my Riding Cloak And the rest of my wearing ~~clothes~~
 to be equally divided to my two Daughters Rebecca Beall
 and Anna Harrison to them or their heirs And last-
 ly I do hereby appoint and constitute my son now

Leith B. Harrison and Chas. Doney my heirs and
sole Executors of this my last will and Testament
hereby revoking and making void all other Wills
and Testaments whatever In Witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal
this thirtyeth day of Aug^r 1792.

 die without Issue their part or parts to be equally
 divided amongst the survivors. Also I nominate

 ing this only to be my last Will and Testament as
