 being of sound mind and memory and knowing that
 it is appointed unto all men once to die have made
 and obtained this to be my last will and Testament
 (revoking all others heretofore made) in manner & form
 following that is to say

In the first place I give and bequeath unto my son
 Benjamin Stigler the tract of land and plantation
 whereon I now live containing 142 acres more or less to
 him his heirs or assigns forever being made up of three
 different surveys viz 125 acres of Balise convey 25 of
 Lincoln and 14 of Rogers and it is my will & desire
 that if any claim or encumbrance should disturb
 the B. Benjamin my son in the quiet possession of this
 tract or plantation that all costs and damages
 shall be paid out of the residue of my estate ex-
 cepting my wife Sarah's lawful demand -

In the second place I give and bequeath to my
 daughter Gilly Stigler a certain tract or parcel of
 land containing 200 acres more or less lying in
 Hardin County on Rough Creek &c. &c. having
 a bond for the same assigned by Samuel Brown
 the right being in William Tool of Shelby County &c.
 State of Kentucky and also one feather bed and
 furniture and one side saddle

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary
 Brown five pounds

Fourthly all the rest and residue of my estate real
 and personal not disposed of in the manner aforesaid
 I will and desire shall be divided into several
 seven equal parts or shares that is to say Sally
 Brown, Sally Snyder, Charlotte C. Bridge and
 Nancy Dory each one share the children of
 my daughter James Lane Furnam one share
 and Benjamin Stigler and Gilly each one share
 to have and their heirs and assigns forever

Fifthly I do hereby appoint my son in law
 James Brown Charles Wortham and Pratt Dorey
