I do hereby give and bequeath to my wife Elizabeth Shuckliffe all my Estate both real and personal during her widowhood or natural life, and after her death to be equally divided among all my children both real and personal Estate but in case my wife should marry again my will is that my Estate both real and personal be divided among all my children as above directed, and I hereby appoint my wife sole and sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking

All former wills and wills by me heretofore made - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 15th day of June 1791 - Signed sealed & acknowledged by Tho^s Shuckliffe to be his last will & Testament in the presence of us

In the name of God amen I Peter Brown
being sick of body but of perfect mind and memory thank
be to god for it therefore calling to mind that it is appoin-
ted for all men to die I do make and Ordain this my
last will and Testament this 15th day of January 1792
First and principally of all I do give my soul to
Almighty God that gave it and my body to the earth
from whence it came to be buried in such Christian
like manner as my Executor hereafter named shall
think fit nothing doubting but at the general Resurrec-
tion I shall receive the same again by the mighty power
of Almighty God and as touching such worldly goods as
God has blessed me with I dispose of them in the manner
and form following Viz. I give and bequeath unto
my loving wife Frances Brown my now dwelling
Plantation with one hundred acres of land thence
adjoining during her natural life after her decease this
tract of land to be equally divided in quality and
quantity between my sons Jacob and Brown and
Peter Brown except the improvement which Jacob and
Brown is to have, and if Jacob and Brown gets Peter
