my last will, and Testament, in manner and form following,
that is to say, first of all I recommend ~~my~~ my soul to
God who gave it. My body to the earth from whence it came to
be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my
Executors hereafter named. & as to the worldly Estate it hath
pleased God to give me I dispose of it in the following manner.
Imprimis) My will and desire is that all my Just debts and
Funeral charges be first paid & satisfied. Item, I give and be-
queath to my beloved Sister Eliz^a. Owens during the term of her
natural life One third of the Profits arising from the plantation
on Tract of Patrick McGee which said Plantation after
her decease goes to my Brother John Edwards King. I also give
and bequeath to my said Sister Eliz^a. Owens during her natural
life one Negro Girl Called Cato which said Negro after my said Sister
decease goes to my Brother John E. King & I further give to my
said Sister Eliz^a. Owens one half the increase of the said Negro

Cale. that shall be raised from her during the life of my said
sister, to her and her heirs for ever. Also, I give and bequeath
to beloved Brother John Edwards King his plantation &
Land purchased of Patrick Miller, he paying annually to
his sister Eliza. Dowers one third part the profits arising from
the said plantation during her life to him his heirs and
assigns for ever. I also give my said Brother John King
after the Death of his sister Eliza. Dowers one Negro called Cale
and one half her increase that shall have been raised from her
to him and his heirs & assigns for ever. I further give my s.
Brother John King, two hundred acres of land in Jefferson
County, known by the name of the Upper land to receive the
same I have possession after the death of Eliza. Dowers to whom
I have left the said Land during her natural life and I
further give to my Brother John King my present appor-
tel with my saddle Bridle & Hardside Saddle to him & his
heirs for ever. Also, I give and bequeath to Eliza. Dowers
daughter of Mary Broadhead during her natural life two hundred
acres of land, her choice out of five hundred acres of my

land in Jefferson County known by the name of the Upper
land on which she is now living and at her death goes to my
Brother John King. I also give to the said Eliza. Dowers my
Negro called Jemie & have thousand weight of Silver to her &
her heirs and assigns for ever. Also, my will and desire is
that all the rest of my Estate, real and personal be equally
divided between my beloved Mother & my two sisters
and Brothers King & that my Brother part at his decease go to
my two Brothers William and William to whom their heirs
& assigns forever
I also hereby fully appoint my Family and beloved Friend
George & Cutbert Harrison executors of this my last will and
testament hereby making and making void all other wills by
me heretofore made, declaring this only to be my last will and
testament, in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this 13th day of February, 1790. —

Nelson County and State of Virginia being in perfect health
calling to mind the Mortality of body and uncertainty of
human life do make certain Constitute, Appoint, Give, my
last will and Testament Viz. Principally and first of all
I recommend my soul to God that gave it and my body
to be buried in a Christian like decent manner at
the Discretion of my Executors and, In my lastly estate
which it has pleased God to bless me with in this life I
give and dispose of the same in the following manner
first of all I give and bequeath to Elizabeth my wife be-
half

half all my stock and moveables I give and bequeath unto my
beloved son Joseph one half of my land and I likewise do will
and bequeath unto my younger son Edward the other half of
that land that I live on and the Tract of land that I am to
get of Andrew Hinds to be equally divided between my son
Joseph and Edward and if neither of them live to get an
Lawfull Righten Ease, then that land is to be divided equ-
ally divided. Between my beloved wife Elizabeth my beloved
Brother Silas Hart. I do here appoint Edward Raulings and
Stephen Raulings and Samuel Hayscraft my three Executors and
I do hereby acknowledge this my last will and Testament

this 6th day of September One thousand seven hundred &
