last will and Testament all and singular
my lands, meadows and tenements, together
freely to be disposed of, possessed of and enjoyed
and I do heartily utterly, disallow, revoke &
disanul all and every other former testament
wills, legacies bequests and Executors by me
in any ^{ways} before named willed and bequeathed
ratifying and confirming this and no other to
be my last will and Testament In Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal
