E. In the Name of God Amen, I Dinah Richards of Nelson
County being of sound Mind & Memory do make
this my last will & Testament. First I recommend my
Soul to God, and as for the worldly Estate wherewith the Lord
has blessed me, I dispose of it in the following Manner, all
lawful Debts being first paid, I give to my two sons Thomas
Richy and John Richy and my Daughter Ruth Crawford
five Pounds each, I give to my Daughter Elizabeth and
her heirs forever the tract of Land wheron I now reside &
at my death, all my Household Furniture of every kind
together with the wearing apparel, Stock of every kind, and
whenever whatever grows there may be on the premises
together with the Flax & Cotton, I give to be equally divided
between my two Daughters Elizabeth & Mary, I give and
bequeath to my daughter Mary twenty pounds and all the
residue of my estate not before particularly disposed of is to
be equally divided among all my Children, except what comes
I now have or may have, at my decease, which is to be divided
between my Daughters Elizabeth and Mary, except
also a Bay mare Colt two years old next June, which I
give to my Daughter Elizabeth, to whom I also give the
Black Heger which she claims, and as there should be
any linen or cloth not made up, I give it be equally

divided between my two Daughters Elizabeth & Mary,
I do hereby appoint my sons Thomas & John Richy Ex-
ecutors and the Survivor of them Executor of this my last
Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former wills
by me made, Declaring this only to be my last will and
Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and affixed my Seal this 14th day of March
1796 as in and to the said Dinah D. Richy

E. In the name of God Amen, I Charity Dunt of the
County of Nelson in the State of Kentucky being of
the mercy and goodness of God, the wish in God yet of a
sound and perfect understanding and Memory do con-
stitute this my last will and Testament, and desire
it to be received by all as such. I recommend I give, long
Dear and loving wife, Mary Ann my Daughter during her
widowhood this house wherem I now dwell, all the
furniture and the whole of the lands & tenements
that I inhabit it with the Stock & farming utensils
except what I shall hereafter mention

After the Death of my said wife Mary Ann Dant or bearing of Widowhood, to be equally divided between my two sons John Dant & William Dant to them & their heirs forever. I then give to my loving wife Mary Ann Dant fifteen dollars for her own private purposes. I then fallow give & bequeath to my wife Mary Ann Dant the sum of seventy Pounds Currency of the State of Maryland during her widowhood, after a due Collection is made of the London notes I have now in possession, for the purpose of purchasing a suitable negro to assist her this life, after her decease to be equally divided between the above mentioned Sons & Daughters Elizabeth Monarch. I then give unto my Son William Dant a Bay Mare I bought of Jacob Pease to him & his heirs forever. I then in my Will that all the lands I have lying in Breckenridge County Salt Lick Creek State of Kentucky after ~~Decease~~ are taken agreeable to bond to be sold to the highest Bidder for money or suitable property as the heirs shall choose, to be equally divided between my two sons and Daughters to wit John Dant William Dant and Elizabeth Monarch to them & their heirs forever. I then do constitute James Dant Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty first day of Feb^r eighteen hundred and four.

In the name of God Amen, I Hannah Parnes of Nelson County and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and Memory but calling to Remembrance the Mortality of the Human Race & knowing that it is appointed for all Men & Woman once to die, I therefore make & declare this my last will and Testament That is to say, first of all I recommend my Soul to God who gave it and my Body to the dust to be Buried in decent Christian Burial. In the first place I will that my Daughter Charity Fitzpatrick may have my large Bible so long as she liveth and at her death she shall the Bible to my Grand Daughter Ann Cole I also will that my Daughter Charity Fitzpatrick may have my horse and my saddle if any I have at my death but the said Charity Fitzpatrick as her husband Charles Fitzpatrick shall not dispose of said Horse & creature as long as she the said Charity liveth, and at her death she may if the creature living dispose of said Horse & creature and Saddle to whom she pleases in the Wynny family, I also will to my Daughter Charity Fitzpatrick my silver Shoe Buckles. Secondly I will my feather Bed and furniture also my household and Kitchen furniture and farming utensils and Stock of all kinds except one yearling Heifer and one Sow one Dutch oven, ten Bushels of corn twenty pounds of Bacon or pork to that amount
