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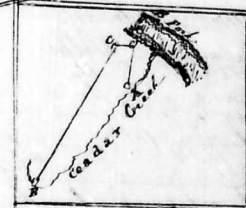
In the name of God amen I Sulhard Tulkerson

Secondly 1150 acres of land to be equally divided
among my children Also I bequeath and ap-
point my sons Jacob and Philip Tulkerson
exutors of this my last will and Testament
and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and
annul all and every other Testament Wills

Legacies and executors by me in any sense before
named Wills and bequeaths ratifying and confirming
this and no other to be my last will and Testament

my hand and seal this Twelfth day of February in the
year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and
twenty Seven
