Manner following (that is to say) First of
all I commit my Soul to God that gave it
to me, and my body to the dust from
whence it came, to be buried after a Christian
manner and after all my Lawfull debts unpaid
I dispose of all the rest of my property in the
following manner

Item I will and bequeath to my oldest
daughter Anna Kude One dollar in Silver & no
more including the property she has heretofore
received — Item I will and bequeath to my
second daughter Elizabeth Baird One Dollar
in Silver and no more of my estate including
the property she has heretofore received —
Item I will to my eldest son Zadock

Aydlett all the lands that I hold by deed or any other way ⁱⁿ Seper County Delaware State and no more of my estate

Item I will and bequeath unto my second son Joshua Aydlett all the cash that he had in his hands that was mine when we parted & all the cash that I empowered him to collect for me in Worcester County State of Maryland or other parts whatsoever But be it remembered that the said Joshua is never to have nor receive any part nor portion from my estate then what he has received hereof

Item I will and bequeath unto my third daughter Mary McDowell one negro boy called Standby one negro girl called Black Leah by which she is known also one sixth part of the quantity of Land that on Green river near Painter Creek after all legal demands are paid out of it and discharged there to be hers and to remain her lawfull property or her heirs lawfully begotten, but if she dies without such issue then all that give her is to return to

my state and the said Mary is to have none of my Estate than what she has received

Item I will and bequeath to my fourth daughter Leah Holland Aydlett one negro girl called yellow Leah one negro boy called Jack, but be it remembered that those negroes is not to be sold or disposed by her but to be hers and her lawfull issue for ever at her disposal; other ways to return to my sons. John & Benjamin Aydlett also one sixth part of all the land on Green River near Painter Creek after all legal demands are paid & discharged;

Item I will & bequeath unto my son John Aydlett all the plantation and track of land I now live upon after his mother's widowhood and one negro gal named Ester after his mother's death to be his with all her issue & one negro man called Isaac after his mother's widowhood one negro boy named Bill one good horse, bridle & saddle but be it understood that those negroes is not to be sold by him or any other person in his behalf, but to remain to him and the lawfull issue

of his body as he pleases to dispose of them
 If dying without such issue the negroes
 with their increase to return to my daughter
 Leah Holland Aydtitt and to my son
 Benj^r Aydtitt likewise if dying without
 such issue the plantation to return to
 my son Benj^r Aydtitt only. Also
 two hundred acres of land lying on the
 waters of bear Creek Also all the moneys
 due me out of John Reed estate.

Item I will and bequeath unto my
 son Benj^r Aydtitt one negro woman
 named Rose one child named Peter one
 Boy named Houdy and all the money
 due me from Philip Reed and all her
 issue also all the land remaining on
 Green river near panter Creek also one
 horse saddle and bridle and if my
 son Benjamin should dye without
 Lawfull issue to return with equal
 proportion to my son John and
 daughter L. H. Aydtitt.

Also the s^d Benj^r is prohibited from selling
 or disposing off or with the ^{the} negroes given to him
 by this Item but to be at his disposal to the
 Lawfull issue of his body.

Item I will to my wife Christian
 Brintingham Aydtitt one negro man
 named James also all the utensils of tools
 horses, cattle, hogs & hays and all household
 furniture of which to be at her disposal &
 all the money on hand all the cash Debts
 that is due not given other ways by this will
 and the s^d Christian my wife for the use of said
 Plantation stock and other things herein men-
 tioned rise my two children John & Benj^r
 Aydtitt untill they are twenty one years of age
 and to school them till they are learnt and have
 good English Education. And I constitute &
 appoint my wife Christian B. Aydtitt the
 whole manager of this my last Estate and to
 pay of my heirs agreeable to my will.
 Item a tract of land lying on Ashes Creek
 to be sold by my wife.
