other Will or Testament heretofore by me

This last and Will and Testament of William
Blewett a^r? was proved by the Oaths of Burn
Harrison and James Smiley two of the subscribing
witnesses thereto and Orated to record
Teste Benrayson C. C.

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In the name of God, Amen: I George Black
of the County of Mead and State of Kentucky
being sick and weak, but of sound mind & memory
do Orate this my last Will & Testament
my body I resign to the earth, & my soul
to them that guard it. It is my Will & desire
after all my Just Debts is paid that my
Property shall be disposed of in the manner
that shall be hereafter directed -
1st I Will and bequeath unto my dear beloved
wife, Sarah Black the plantation with all
its improvements, where I now live on and to
be a home for my children, while they come
of age and to be equally divided at the decease
of my Wife, between my two Sons James
Black and Joseph Black -
2^d Will and bequeath unto my wife one Negro
woman Mary during her life to make her more
able to school and raise her children -
3^d It is my Will that George Anthony should be
killed out, after he comes to the age of eighteen
and the money paid to interest, until the
children come of lawful age and to be
equally divided between them as they come of
age - 4th I Will and bequeath unto my wife
one brown horse and one brown and white
horses and furnished two cows and calves & the
Negro woman on the plantation for the
Use of the family -

5th I will and bequeath unto my Son George & Charles statingly twenty dollars to be paid to him when he comes of lawful age —

6th It is my Will and Desire that as much of my Drops as is thought sufficient for the support of the family for one Year be applied for that purpose —

7th It is my Will that there should be a said of all my property & the money put to interest for the Use of my Children and equally divided between them, except my & wife's one third part of the money rising from said — 8th It is my Will when my youngest child comes of age that Anthony be equally divided between them and at the decease of my wife for Mary to be equally divided between the whole of my Children —

9th It is my Will and Desire that my wife Mary Clarke be my executrix & Joseph Clarke my executor to this my last Will & Testament In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hands and affixed my Seal this 17 day November 1827 —
