I give and bequeath to my loving wife Elizabeth Ducher all the rest of my moveable estate as followeth my slave negro Jack is to be free at my aforesaid

wifes death, death, but it my Will that he shall tend my plantation and have one fourth of the crop he raises and that he is to have horses and Farming utensils tools to raise the crop and have a house to carry his produce to market, but if he should be dissident and neglect his work my aforesaid wife shall have liberty to hire him out the term of her natural, Likewise my slave Hannah is to be free at my aforesaid wifes death Likewise this aforesaid slave Hannahs Children to wit, Joseph James Titus & Anna and all the children that Hannah shall have hereafter shall be free at the age of twenty one years old. If my aforesaid wife dies before they come to that age but to be her property during her natural life. I leave my aforesaid plantation to my aforesaid ~~plantation~~ wife with all appertinances during the term of natural life. ^{give and} Then I bequeath it
