my present dwelling house one bed & furni-
ture, One large black mare, three cows, the
choise of my stock ten head of hogs, One
pot, dutch oven & frying pan one bedstead
& spring wheel, two chairs a table, cupboard
and all the furniture therunto belonging, all
which she is to enjoy during her natural life &

After her death it is to be equally divided between my two youngest sons, Alexander & William whom I wish to be tolerably well educated & for that purpose I leave ten pounds in property. I then give to my son Joseph M Daniel fifty Acres of land to include the Improvement on which he formerly lived, I also give to my son Lewis fifty Acres of land to include the improvement whereon he now resides, & I give to my sons Solomon & James fifty Acres of land each, the remaining fifty Acres, I give to my two sons Alexander and William all which tracts are to be laid off in as handsome a form as the situation of the whole tract will admit of and so as to make each tract equal in value not considering the present improvements made thereon the balance of my estate I desire to be sold for cash and the money rising therefrom to be divided in the following

manner, To my daughter Leah twenty five pounds the balance to be equally divided between my daughter Rebecca and son Elias, and if each of their shares do not amount to fifty pounds, those to whom I have given lands are to make them equal to their own (in property) out of the above mentioned property which I have directed to be sold. I give to my son James one pound here till two years, and next spring I do appoint my friends E. Adams and George M. deary Executors to this ^{last} Will & Testament

If my aforesaid wife dies before they come to that age but to be her property during her natural life.
