To my daughter Polly I give a negro boy by the name of Joseph. Also to Harriett, my daughter a negro Girl by the name of Lucy - Likewise to my daughter Eliza a negro Girl by the name of Jane. To Betty another of my daughters I bequeath a Negro girl by the name of Milly - And to my son George I also bequeath a Negro boy by the name of Isaac - Also to my last daughter Bruey I bestow a Negro Woman by the name of Nancy -

There are still five negroes remaining in my estate which with their increase is to be divided among my children Ann & Bruey excepted when P. Greasy shall have attained to the age of sixteen - All my horses except hornet is to remain on the plantation until my youngest daughter shall arrive to the age above mentioned age - All the rest of my property is to re-

main on the plantation until P. Greasy shall attain to the age of 21 and then to be equally divided among my children.
