I John Smith of Nelson County in the State of Kentucky and with the blessing of God in perfect health and sound disposing mind memory and understanding do make publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form as following. I give & bequeath to my son John Smith all my real and little to a tract of land in the second settlement called choice choice situated on the waters of ten mile creek and five shillings sterling. I give & bequeath to my son Richard Smith one negro man named Ben one man named Lige one cow one calf during his life and after his death to be equally divided among his lawfully begotten children. I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Smith one negro man named Henry and one negro boy named Ben one large looking glass &c. I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Rosolins one cow and calf, feather bed and furniture but my will is that the bed and furniture

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furniture be equally divided between John
 Bowler and John Adams. 5th I give
 bequeath to my son Charles Smith forty
 pounds. 6th I give and bequeath to my
 son James Smith forty pounds. 7th I give
 and bequeath to my grand children Richard
 Smith's sons Joseph and Lucy Smith one
 negro woman named Susannah. My will
 is that my wife Ann Smith shall hold
 all my estate which I have bequeathed to
 my several children above mentioned during
 her widowhood. My will is that my
 two sons Richard Smith and Joseph Smith
 shall have the land I now live on lying
 on Trace Creek and all my household
 furniture and what is remaining of
 my estate after my just debts is paid
 I leave my two sons Richard & Joseph Smith
 whole and sole Executors of this my last will
 and Testament and I do by this present will
 revoke and disannul all former wills by
 me hereof made. In Testimony whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal
 this seventh day of January one thousand
 eight hundred.
