the State of Kentucky being in perfect health
have thought proper to make and ordain this
my last Will and testament in manner
following and first I recommend my soul to
God who gave it and my ~~soul~~ Body to be buried
in a Christian like manner, and as for my
worldly estate I leave as follow - Item I
give ~~and~~ to my Son Nathaniel Gageby
two Negroes viz Ailee and young Moses
to him and his heirs forever - Item I
give ~~and~~ to Son William Gageby one Negro
named

named Isaac another named Ailee (person dead
he the said William inhonors my Estate
from a debt formerly owing to Jacob Ramsey
and which he has paid) to him and his heirs
forever Item I give to Son John Gageby one
Cow and calf one feather bed and furniture,
six sheep and new pot one dish and six
pewter plates to him and his heirs forever
Item I give to my son Joseph Gageby the
Ballance of the tract of land wherein I now
live (not otherwise given) three Negroes viz
Ding, Kate, and James one feather bed
and furniture one cow and calf six sheep
one dish and six pewter plates to him and his
heirs forever Item I give to my daughter
Susanna Ramsey one Negro girl formerly
mentioned in a deed of gift named Patience
to her and her heirs forever Item I give to
my daughter Elizabeth Mason two negro
viz Piss and Elie to her and her heirs forever
Item I give to my son James Gageby five
pewter plates Item I give to Samuel
Eskeidge son to Sam Eskeidge fully shelling
I leave in hands of my wife Susanna and two
sons Mark and Lench Gageby and Lench
Smith

South son to my wife one hundred
 and fifty acres of land part of the tract
 whereon I now live to include the house
 and plantation together with six Negroes
 viz. Mow, Mary, Palt, James and son
 John and two servants viz. Roger Gohanson
 and Charlotte Rivers with all the rest and
 residue of my Estate unmentioned for
 the support and maintenance of my wife
 and said Mark Crook and Linton who
 is disabled during the term of their na-
 tural lives or my said wife or daughter
 and after their deaths the lands above
 mentioned are to be divided in my son Joseph
 to him and his heirs forever and the other
 part of the Estate viz. Negroes &c. is to be
 equally divided between sons Nathaniel
 William, John, Joseph and daughter Su-
 sanna and Elizabeth and their heirs forever
 I leave in the hands of my executors two
 certificates of money lodged in the Loan
 Office of Virginia in order to discharge debts
 due British subjects and if they should not be
 sufficient each of the Legates are to pay in
 proportion to what is given them above suf-
 ficient to discharge the aforesaid debts
 Truly

lastly I constitute and appoint my wife
 Susanna executrix and son Nathaniel Gregory
 and son Joseph Gregory
 Executors of this my last Will and Testament
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand and seal this 13th day of May 1801

 the executors therein named and ordered to be
 recorded and on the motion of the said executors
 certificate is granted them for obtaining probat
 thereof and from they having given bond
 with John Young, John Duncan & Daniel
 Staddon their securities in the penalty of ten
 thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs
