Whereas Solomon Lawrence of Nelson County and State of Kentucky being Sick and weak in Body, but of perfect mind and Memory knowing the frailty of all flesh as make, ordain and constitute this my last will and Testament, and by these Presents do annul, revoke and set aside all former Wills or legacies whatsoever by me bequeathed —

First I recommend my Soul to God, who gave it me also my Body to be decently interred at the Discretion of Josiah Bratby and my wife Ann Lawrence whom I make, ordain and constitute my lawful Executors — Secondly after discharging my lawfull Debts, I order and direct that the Ground now lying and what will admit of being cleared between the field and the House to be for the support of my Wife and family — I do will and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Purdy the sum of one Dollar lawfull money of the State of Kentucky — I do will to my son James Lawrence I will one hundred acres of Land to be laid off in the lower end of the Survey. I do will to my son William Lawrence I will one hundred acres of Land adjoining the above mentioned lots on the upper side — I do will to my son Samuel Lawrence I will one hundred acres of Land next adjacent to the above lot. I do will to my son Robert Lawrence I will one hundred acres of Land being the upper Place or where the House stand with the following Reserve respecting the above lots, that when my youngest Daughter Fanny comes to mature age the Different lots to be laid off according to quantity & quality, that is to say, that he whose lot shall have a Superiority in respect of Quality shall pay unto him that is Deficient agreeable to the Judgement of two or more disinterested men who shall Judge of the quality of the Land or other advantages occurring —

Item also that James, William, Samuel and Robert Lawrence by their joint efforts each respectively pay in Horse, saddle and clothing to Sonny & Ann, Mary and Fanny Lawrence my Daughters to the amount of thirty five Pounds lawfull money by the award of disinterested Persons if they themselves cannot agree thereon upon the 1st Sonny, Ann, Mary and Fanny Lawrence upon each respectively arriving to mature age and lastly that all my Personal estate after selling so much as will discharge my Debts & Expenses inapartly accruing up to the use of my family and remain at the Disposal of my wife Ann Lawrence. Signed, sealed and delivered in the Presence of us the subscribers as witnesses this twenty first Day of July. Eighteen Hundred & six
