my heirs - and it is my Will and Desire first
That all my Just Debts be paid, next
That it is my Will and Desire that John
Hudson Receiver be only so far as from my
Executors at the time they see the said
Plantation and settle off with the rest of
my heirs - and it is my Will and Desire
That the Remainder of my estate that is
not hereof bequeathed, shall be equally
Divided amongst my bloodred &c
