Know ye that I William Humphrey of Nelson
County and State of Kentucky being of a sound mind
enjoying the right use of my reason do constitute and
make this my last will and testament revoking
all others of the like nature. First. I commend my
Soul to God my redeemer and my Body to be decent-
ly buried and after my Funeral Expenses is paid

that my whole Estate be disposed of in the
following manner Viz. I give unto my lov-
ing Wife Mary Humphrey during her widowhood
the Tract of Land whereon I now live containing three
hundred and five Acres with all the appertinances
thereof the Kitchen and House &c Furniture farm-
ing utensils Three head of work Horses and all the rest
of my live Stock together with all my Slaves but
in case she should marry One third part of my Estate
During her natural life to hold in peaceable pos-
session. I then I give and bequeath to my son George
Humphrey and my Daughter Sarah Battee and their
Heirs forever two hundred Acres of Land lying in War-
rington County on Parkers Turn to be equally divi-
ded so that they interfere not with each others Im-
provement. I then I give and bequeath to my three Sons
John Humphrey, William Humphrey and Samuel Hum-
phrey and two Daughters Susannah and Elizabeth Hum-
phrey To them and their Heirs forever five Hundred
and forty Acres of land lying in the County of Henry
and on the Waters of Kentucky River to be
Divided according to quantity and quality
I then I give to my son Simon Humphrey
and my two Daughters Nancy and
Mary Humphrey and their Heirs
forever the tract and parcel of land
whereon I now live containing three
Hundred and five acres to be divided

between them according to quantity and quantity after the Death of my Wife Mary.

Item It is my will and Desire that all my Children that has not received a horse and Saddle Bed and Furniture should be furnished with them as they arrive at full age. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Susannah Humphrey after the Death of my Wife Mary Humphrey one Negro Woman named Milly and her Increase to her and her Heirs for ever and in case she should amount to more than her proportional part of the Negro Property the said Susannah shall account with the rest of the heirs for the same but if it should not amount to an Equal part with the rest then it is to be made up to her by the rest of the Children out of my Estate not yet disposed of. Item It is my will and Desire after the Death of my Wife that all the rest of my Negroes be divided and Equally divided between all the rest of my Children that shall then be living. Item It is my will and desire that after

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the Death of my loving Wife Mary Humphrey and all my Just Debts paid and collected that all the rest of my Estate not yet disposed be sold and the money equally divided among all my Children that shall then be living. Item It is my will and desire that after the Death of my wife that if my Daughter Mary Humphrey should not be judged Capable of taking care of herself that her part of my Estate be sold and the money lodged in the hands of my Daughter Susannah whom I leave as Guardian to the said Money for the sole purpose of supporting her during life. signed and sealed in presence of
