1st I will that all my lawfull Debts be paid
 2^d I will that my wife Mary shall have that part of my land in the State of Ohio which lies South of Moses Crummys land being a part of the west half Sect. 34 Town 3. Range No 3 for her sole use during her natural life

3^d I will that my two sons John & James shall have that part of my land which lies North of the above Crummys land being a part of the above Sect. 34 and if the same should not contain one hundred acres then they shall have what will make it up one hundred acres in the South east corner of the other parcels of my land as above named for their use & behoof forever

4th I will that all what moveable property there shall be left of mine after my debts be paid

shall be given to my beloved wife for her own proper use during her life

5th I will that if there shall be any part of my property remaining after the decease of my wife that my two Daughters Elizabeth and Jane shall have the former a bow and the latter a side saddle and a bow and if there should be any thing left afterward that it shall be equally divided between my children
 6th I will that after the decease of my wife all that part of my land which is not given to my two sons in this will shall be equally divided between my five Daughters to wit, Margaret Sarah Mary Elizabeth & Jane

7th And last I will that my wife Mary and my two sons John & James shall be my Executors to execute this my last will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of September One thousand eight hundred and four
