make and ordain this piece of writing as my
last Will and Testament that all my just
debts and funeral Expenses be paid also I give
and bequeath unto my beloved wife Jane all my
household and Kitchen furniture and moveable
property and I give and bequeath to my son
William Marshall fifty acres of land adjoining
John Richs which he now lives on also I give &
bequeath unto my son John fifty acres of land on
the back line also the balance of the land I
give and bequeath to my beloved wife Jane for
ever and at her death I nominate Marshall
and James Marshall to have her part of

the land also I give and bequeath to all my children
five shillings each, lastly, I constitute and ap-
point my wife Jane Marshall to be my executrix
and my son William Marshall to be my executor
of this my last will & Testament revoking all former
wills and bequeaths by me made & ratifying and
confirming this only as my last will & Testament in
whereof I have to these presents set my hand this 1st
day of November 1803. signed sealed published
pronounced & Declared by the s^d William Marshall
as his last Will and Testament in presence of us the

2. In the name of God amen, I Thomas Heady of
the County of Nelson and State of Kentucky being of
sound sense and memory at present but being sick
and weak in body do make this my last will and
testament in the manner and form following to-wit
First my desire is that all my just Debts be just
paid, Item I lend unto my beloved wife Rebekah Heady
One third part of the land whereon I live during her
Natural life, I also lend unto my wife my negro
woman called Phely and her child Libby during her
natural life, and also lend to my wife ~~the~~ her
natural life one third part of every other species
of property that I possess together with all debts due me
Item I give and bequeath to my son Stillwell Heady
two thirds of ^{the} land I live on, and at my wifes death I
give to my son Stillwell Heady the third part of
my land that I have lent to my wife as above

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these Stillwell Heady to pay to the Children of my legatee the sum of
thirty pounds in good trade which land I give to my son
Stillwell Heady and his heirs or assigns forever he paying thirty
pounds in trade as above and at my wifes death my desire
is that all my personal property and Negroes be sold and the
money arising therefrom to be equally divided amongst my child-
ren namely Th^s Heady, Martha Spadin, Elizabeth Collins,
Rebekah Drake James Heady Mary Salterwood and Charity-
Hurgeon, my son Stillwell Heady to have three years after my
wifes death to pay the above mentioned thirty pounds in,
lastly I appoint my Wife Rebekah Heady executrix, my
son Th^s Heady James Heady and Stillwell Heady executors
of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former
and other wills by me heretofore made Ratifying this to be
my last will and testament, In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this 10th day of August 1799
