Know all men by these presents that I Eliza Burkhead being of advanced age but
of sound mind think proper to obtain and make this my last will and testament
revoking all others heretofore made by me Viz.

1st My body is to be decently buried
2^d I hereby bequeath unto my son Abraham fifty acres of Land to be taken of the
plantation whereof I now live do born as I am deceased the land to run so as to
include his present house and outhouses and to run along the Land of William
Glennister thro the whole line of the tract from East to West and to include
a due proportion of Timber for the Support of the house

3^d I hereby bequeath and devise to my wife Susannah the Balance of my
Plantation all my Stock of Horses Cattle, plantation tools house hold and
kitchen furniture and all manner and every Species of Property I may be
in possession at the time of my decease and to have the full control
and use of the same for and during her natural life

After the Decease of my wife Susannah

the property hereby left to her use is to be divided Equally among all my
Children

I hereby appoint my son Abraham sole Executor to this my will and
testament witnesses my hand this 9th day of January 1828

Eliza Burkhead

At a County court held for Nelson County on Monday the 12th day of May 1828 —

This will and testament of Eliza Burkhead deceased was proved by the oaths of Cyrus
Pitts Thomas L Thompson & James Brown the subscribing witnesses thereto
and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of Abraham Burkhead the Executor therein named
he having given bond with Thomas L Thompson & Richard L Thompson his Sureties,
in the sum of five hundred dollars conditioned as prescribed by Law and having taken
the oath the law in such cases directs it is ordered that a copy of the said will be given
to the said Abraham Burkhead

In the name of God Amen. I William Chinnorwith of the County of
Nelson and State of Kentucky considering the uncertainty of this mortal
life and the certainty of Death, I being of sound and perfect mind
and memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same, do make public
and declare this to be my last will and testament in manner and form
following, Viz. First of all I want all my just debts to be speedily paid, after
which I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Chinnorwith the one third
part of my home plantation, including the dwelling house and as much of
the household furniture as she may choose to keep, also negro Bets and Gin
and her choice of all my horses also her choice of two milch cows, during her
natural life and at her death the above mentioned property to be sold and
the proceeds thereof equally divided amongst my children, in manner and
form herein after mentioned. Item, I give & bequeath to my youngest son James
H. Chinnorwith (as I expect he will live with his mother until her death, main-
tain and take care of her) one negro boy named Jack, and his choice of
two of all my horses, one waggon and four pair of waggon gears, two plows
& two axes, two hoes and all the crops of corn and my crops, cut saw and at
it my express will, that he shall receive three hundred dollars mentioned
in a note accompanying this will, as a compensation for his three last past
years services, and work which he did for me, also my noted silver watch, in token of
my love, which he is to have over and above his equal portion and it is my desire
for him to keep it during his life, also it is my will and desire the above men-
tioned articles (the watch and note above mentioned excepted, at their retail
value, as a part of what he is entitled to as one of my heirs, and as I keep a
book of charges and accounts and receipts against him and all my other
children, so that each may have an equal share of my estate, it is my wish that
what now stands on the book against him, or what receipts I may now have against
him or the rest of my children, or what receipts or book accounts I may
hereafter have against any of them. It is my express will and desire that may
be estimated and accounted as so much of their part of what they may be
entitled to as my heirs and deducted from their part accordingly. The amount
of what I now have against my son Harden Chinnorwith, is at this time, is as the
part which I wish to be deducted out of his part of the proceeds of my estate
One thousand five hundred Ninety seven dollars and forty cents. To my daughter
Leticia Hawkins and to her children lawfully begotten of her body, I give
the plantation which she at present resides in, in Harden County and State
of Kentucky said to contain one hundred & twenty one & a half acres, which
is to be considered and valued as five hundred dollars of the part to which she
