Charles Nininck & the then Roman Catholic Bishops, of Kentucky, the following property to be enjoyed by them and the survivors, and survivors the lawful heirs of the last survivor for ever, To wit the land and Plantation I Bought of Charles Campbell and a negroman named Clemmy Provided they shall discharge a bond of three hundred and eighty five Dollars and eighty cents to w^{it} H. Hyges of Bardstown and one hundred & forty seven and one half Dollars to my sister in law Clean Ciguel and Provided my wife shall have during her single life the privilege of Any Timber and of the Orchard &c. My other debts, if any shall be paid out of the Produce of my Plantation which can be spared, and out of my stock Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my said Beloved wife Ann Howard Executrix of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this twenty eight day of May one thousand eight hundred and Ten.
