hands of my loving wife Susanna Remy until I son
Butler arrives at Lawfull age and should the S. Butler die
without lawfull heir and before arriving at Lawfull age
then it is my will and I hereby direct that that legacy be-
queathed to him and the legacy bequeathed to my wife Susanna
Remy be equily divided between my three Children following
to wit Ann King, Jane Wootton & Nathaniel Remy or their
heirs, and it is my will and I hereby direct that in case my
son Butler should survive my loving wife Susanna Remy
that every part of my Estate both real and personal here-
before bequeathed to her shall descend to him my son Butler
at the death of my loving wife and I do further direct that all
my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of the legacies
bequeathed to my loving wife and son Butler Remy
and lastly I do appoint my loving wife Susanna Remy
