Es In the name of God amen. I Thomas Allen Sen^r of Nelson
 County and State of Kentucky Possessing a sound mind and
 memory. Knowing that Death is certain to all men Do make
 this my last will. Revoking all former wills made by me and
 declaring this my only will. I wish and desire that after
 my Decease my property may be divided and disposed of

as follows. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sally Rowan a certain Negro Girl named Abby and one hundred Dollars in notes which I have assigned to her Husband Andrew Rowan. I wish her to keep all the property which I have given her hereafter free from the claim of any of my other Heirs. I will and Bequeath to my Grand Daughter Polly Singleton a certain Negro Girl named Rachel. It is my wish that my Daughter Sally Rowan may keep the Negro Girl Rachel untill Polly Singleton arrives at lawful age to Her Heir.

I Bequeath to my Grand Daughter Ann Maria Allen (Daughter of my son John) one Negro Girl named Caroline which I wish to be in the care of my son John Allen untill his Daughter Ann Maria Allen arrives at lawful age to Her Heir.

I Bequeath to my son Joseph Allen four Negroes, named as follows, Anne, David, Henry

I Panny. I also give him my Clock and all the Bell. which is due me. I Bequeath to my Daughter Margaret Hesters a certain Negro Girl named Esther. It is my wish that my Daughter Margaret may keep all the property which I have given her hereafter free from the claim of any of my other Heirs.

I Bequeath to my Grand son Oliver Allen a certain Negro Boy named Nelson which will be in the care of my son James Allen untill Oliver Allen arrives at lawful age to His Heir.

I Bequeath to Joseph Allen (son of) and Oliver Allen

(son of my son James) My Farm of Land which is by Estimation Two Hundred acres. when they arrive at lawful age to Heir it. I wish my son James Allen to keep the said Farm of Land in Possession untill Joseph Allen and Oliver Allen arrives at lawful age to receive the same. I Bequeath to my son James Allen a certain Negro man named Tom. I also give him a Release of the Debt entered into By Purchase at my Sale. I wish my son James Allen to Heir all the Property which is not specially devised of by this will and keep all the Property which

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I have Given him hereafter free from the claim of any of my other Heirs.
