Martha Clark, Ann Feltz Clark, Benedict Clark, Rachel
Clark, James Clark, Francis Clark, Mathias Clark, Felix
Clark and it is my will that my Daughter Ann Hagans
three Children shall have one Equal Part as their share
and Bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Sarah Spalding
one Bed and Furniture and Cow and calf.

I nominate constitute and appoint my Beloved wife
Rachel Clark my whole and sole Executrix of this my
last will and Testament in Witness hereof I James
Clark the Testator have hereunto set my hand and affixed
my Seal this 22nd day November Eighteen Hundred and

In the name of God Amen I Cathbert Head of Nelson County and state of Kentucky, being of sound and perfect mind & memory (Blessed be God) do this fifteenth day of April in the year of our lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety eight make and Publish this my last will and Testament in the manner following (Wiz) First I Give and Bequeath to my Son Josy Head the Plantations my son John Head now lives on supposed to contain ninety four acres more or less to him self and the lawfull heirs begotten of his body forever Remainder to my son Frances Head to him and his heirs forever. Secondly I will and bequeath to my said Josy Head Fifteen

Pounds currency to be paid in hand or here more fifteen pounds cash his part of a negro boy provided said negro survives me also two cows and one two year heifer one feather bed and furniture, two Dishes and six plates two pots one case of Knives and forks one ax one hoe three Bacon and five ^{Salted} Hogs with twelve small ones Remainder also to my son Frances Head.

Thirdly I will and bequeath to my son John Head one Dollar having given him his share before or his part

Fourthly I will and Bequeath to my son in law John Head one Dollar also having given him before his part

Fifthly I will and bequeath to my son Frances Head the Plantation I now live on supposed to contain one hundred acres more or less to him and his heirs forever Remainder to my son Josy Head I also will and bequeath to my aforesaid Frances Head all the Remainder of my estate Real and

Personal &c. And I hereby make and ordain my Loving Son Frances Head sole Executor of this my last will and testament

I in witness whereof I the said Cathbert Head have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written
