it is appointed for man once to die, therefore do make
this my last will and Testament in manner and form
following, First, I Give and commend my soul to al-
mighty God that gave it me, and my body after my
death I desire may be buried in a Christian burial at
the discretion of my wife and now for the disposing
of my estate when with it hath been pleas you to
help me I send (after my death to my loving
wife Nancy (In case of all dower) during her natural
life or widowhood all of my estate real and personal that

I am possessed with at this time and all that I shall have coming to me at a future day from the estate of Wm. Brynes Decd. of Lunenburg County Virginia and also all that I shall have coming to me from any other resource whatever to him I lend ^{it} as above mentioned. It is my desire that my wife maintain ~~her~~ out of necessary my children Sally, S. C. John, C. and Nancy and also other children that she may have by me after this time if any such I pronounce them my heirs &c) as well as she conveniently can. ^{Shope} She will bring them up in the fear of the Lord and not let them live in ~~luxury~~ ^{idleness} and give them as good an education as her circumstances will admit of, and make them work pray keep my children out of bad, idle, wicked company and don't let them associate with people of bad character. ^{and} I hope and believe that my wife has such a tender regard for our dear beloved little children that there can be no motive strong enough to induce her to forsake them. I therefore in the name of the Lord give them up to my wife to do the best she can in all things for them. My further will and desire is that at my wife's death or marriage my Estate may be equally divided between my above mentioned children and those that my wife may have from this time untill nine months after my death. I lend to each child ^{an} above mentioned its proportionable part of my estate during its natural life and at each child's death I give to the lawful heir of its body the proportionable part of my estate that falls to him or her here after. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this day and year above wrote.
