The mortality of my body and knowing that I must
soon meet with my change and in order to ~~prevent~~
trouble and disputes that will arise after my decease
I now make and declare this my last will and testament
in the manner following. First I recommend my soul to
god who gave it me my body to the earth to be buried
in a Christian and decent like manner at the discretion
of my Executors I do make aforesaid point and constitute
my truly friends Michael Wrench - Allen and Robert
Johnson to settle dead and dispose of all my possessions
as they shall be directed in this my will now as touching
my worldly Estate and possessions that god has blessed me
with first I direct all my just debts to be paid I do
give grant and bequeath to my my wife Elizabeth the
house wherein I live and the Mills and hardens and Gardens
and one hundred acres of land adjoining the the house and
an equal distance around or on each side and two
Beds and the furniture belonging one table one desk
one cabinet and chest with all Knives forks dishes and all
such ^{as my executors shall think sufficient} Necessaries to keep her and ~~one~~ Negro wench she shall
have her choice of the two young wenches also a horse
Saddles bridle three cows hogs and the sheep other wise
if she should chose to take a child's Part she is to have
it at her Election ^{to} remainder of my Lands and Property
to be Equally divided and each to have an Equal
Part when they are come to lawfull age that is all that is now
living I do give and grant to my Son in Law Benjamin
Shepley ten Dollars but not any more of my Estate their
real or personal nor any part or Share amongst my
Childring more than the ten Dollars willed to him
I do further order and direct that that their shall
be ~~voluntarily~~ collected of my Estate before Distribution is
made of the property to raise all my Childring to the years
of maturity and to give each of them having Equal Land
to what the Elderst has got I also direct that my sons
all that are under Eighteen years of age shall be put
to learn some good trade I also direct that the negroes shall
stay and live with their misters untill the youngest
Child is sixteen years of age in case she & lives single

but where she is or gets married then the negroes to be divided
like the rest of the property I also Bequeath to my son William
Jacobs in Particular land his Equal part with the rest my
Negro George to be his one servant and if the negro ^{shall} ~~should~~ die
before he comes to the years of twenty he is to have
another purchased or the value paid to him and if any of
my Childring should die before the above at the age of
freedom from their parents their Estate to be Equally divided
amongst the rest of their Brethren and Sisters and if any
of the heirs or Legatees should receive any part or portion
where they are married an account shall be set down on the
back of this will and shall stand good to be settled out
of their part of this Estate and when the Land are divided
if anyons part should be lost by law Each Legatee shall
have Equal part I do also deny revoke renounce and dis-
-annul all other wills or Testaments.
