 appoint this my last will and Testament In the first place I
 desire and will that all my Just Debts be paid and Satisfied, and
 as touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased Almighty God
 to bless me with I give ^{bequeath} ~~bequeath~~ bequeath and dispose of the
 same in the manner following to wit. I Particularly will
 and Desire that my beloved wife Elizabeth Heady should remain
 in the full occupation and possession of the plantation whereon
 I now live and enjoy the profits of the same for her
 maintenance and Support during her natural life, and
 also the Negro Girl Liza now in my possession to belong
 entirely to my beloved wife Elizabeth Heady during her
 (Elizabeths) natural life and after that to belong entirely to
 my son Eliza without any control from any party to him and his
 heirs forever and that of my three sons Jacob, Silwell and
 Eliza shall have the place that I now live on after their
 Mother Death and then to be equally Divided between them
 Provided that Silwell do pay unto his two brothers Jacob
 & Eliza the amount of one Hundred and Sixty Dollars
 in property at Cash rates, and Silwell to remain on the same
 corner of the plantation where he now lives and the above
 mentioned three sons to have an equal part in the richards
 unless other wise agreed among them, Also that all my house
 hold furniture to be appraised but not sold until after my
 wife Elizabeths Death Whereas my son James Heady at
 Different times Received from me property to the amount of one
 hundred and twenty one pounds fourteen Shillings and two
 Groves of good value more which is all I intend to bequeath
 him and his heirs forever I also will that my son
 Eliza Heady shall have my place on the east fork of
 Croes Creek containing one hundred and thirty Six acres
 the place whereon he now lives Provided he Eliza pay unto my
 son Eliza the amount of Twenty five pounds in property
 in two years after my Death the plantation to belong

294. to my son Elijah Heady and his ~~two~~ eldest sons Washington and Thomas Heady forever I also will and bequeth to my son Thomas Heady one hundred acres of land lying within Glover and John Goodwin's lines extending towards Satt River for which I have made him a deed to him & his heirs and which is also all that I intend to bequeth him & his heirs forever all my Real and personal estate Whereas I have paid at different times unto my son Elias Heady in good property the full amount of one hundred and thirty two pounds which is all I intend bequething him or his heirs forever And whereas I gave my Daughter Sally in her life time as much as I intended or was capable it is my wish that her children should receive no part of my Estate The property which I gave to my Daughter Sally was as follows fifty acres of good land a good Feather Bed and some Sheep and some household Furniture & I also will and Desire that my three sons Jacob Stillwell and Elisha shall not cut and Divide this place wherein I now live after my Death into small pieces and sell to others But to each other they are at liberty to sell on the whole of the place to any person provided they all three be unanimous and further I will and Desire that after my Death that all the residue of my property to be sold by public Vendue and the money arising from such Sale to be appropriated to my three sons Jacob Stillwell and Elisha's use to them and their ~~heirs~~ ^{Heirs} and their use ~~forever~~ ^{forever} Provided that they (Jacob and Elisha) shall pay unto my son James Heady for the improvements he made on the place that my son Elijah now lives on and I by these presents nominate constitute and appoint my trusty friend Joseph Freeman and my son Stillwell Heady Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby Revoking and Disannulling every other and former will or wills and Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament
